

# Summary of the groups' discussions

To facilitate working with the results of the groups' work, it is useful to ask the groups to summarise their discussions in writing. Choose the questions that are most relevant. The groups will have time to answer two to four questions during a three-hour workshop.

Produce a simple document with the questions and space for written answers to the questions you want the groups to answer. For example:

- Which policy instruments will be used in 20XX (50 years from now) to support a climate-adapted society?
- How will people's attitudes and behaviours have changed?
- What will we have gained or lost compared to today?
- How will society have been transformed?
- Which goal conflicts will have arisen along the way, and how will they have been resolved and/or dealt with?
- Will synergies/new collaborations have emerged? Which ones?

Write a short narrative for the group's own images of the future

You can also ask the groups to summarise their scenarios in the form of a narrative. This requires more time, but is valuable when summarising.

**The results from the groups' discussions will probably require follow-up work. Remember to set aside time for this.**
